Attention New Students

Effective immediately, The Antioch Experience Institute will be charging an administrative fee for all Life Learning Experience Credits and Transfer Credits from other institutions. These credits will be recorded on the student's transcript as a valid part of the local number of semester hour credits earned for a degree.

LLE credits may be awarded to all undergraduate students (up to 25% of the degree being pursued.) LLE credits also may be awarded for master-level students pursuing a degree in Pastoral ministry (up to 25% of the degree being pursued).

No LLE credits may be included on any doctoral program offered at Pillsbury.

Undergraduate students must earn at least 30 of the required 120 credit hours at Pillsbury in order to receive a bachelor's degree from this institution.

Graduate students must earn at least 15 of the required 30 credit hours at Pillsbury in order to be awarded a master's or doctoral degree in Pastoral Ministry.

Antioch's basic tuition rates:

- **Registration Fee - \$50**

- **Master's Studies - \$150 per credit hour**
- **Doctoral Studies - \$200 per credit hour**

Tuition Fees for 2017

The Board of Regents of the Pillsbury-Scarborough Bible College & Seminary and Antioch Experience Institute-Fort Washington has established the following tuition rates effective January 1, 2016.

Tuition fees do not include textbooks and other curriculum materials. Students may pay the tuition balance in full or make monthly payments after an initial down payment has been made.

Undergraduate Degrees (\$100/credit hour)

Associate of Ministry (AMin) in Biblical Studies

60 credit hours -- \$6,000 + \$1,000 (curriculum) = \$7,100

Bachelor of Ministry (BMin) in Biblical Studies

120 credit hours -- \$12,000 + \$1,000 (curriculum) = \$13,000
(without transfer or LLE credits)

Master's Degrees (\$150/credit hour)

The \$50 registration fee will be refunded if the applicant is not accepted as a student. Entering students who submit a registration form for a degree program will have 90 days in which to complete the process, including the payment of the initial fee. After 90 days, the entering student who has not completed the process will be placed on inactive status, the registration form will be invalid, and the \$50 registration fee will be forfeited.

There is an additional \$25 - \$75 per credit hour charge for Life Learning Experience (LLE) credits and some transfer credits. Approved transfer and LLE credits are applied towards the total credit hours needed for some degree completion and graduation. However, students must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours in their course of study at PCS in order to graduate.

**For NCCA counseling degrees, costs include textbooks, clinical supervision, and required APS reports.*

Pillsbury-Scarborough Bible College and Seminary is owned, controlled, and operated by the FreeWay Foundation, a non-profit ministry which provides "practical teaching and training for successful living." The Foundation pays the salaries and benefits of Pillsbury's administration and staff, and faculty members. The College & Seminary is housed at no charge in FreeWay Foundation's spacious building on a beautiful 2 acre campus in northwest St. Louis County. Since the overhead costs are minimal, these substantial savings are passed along to the students in the form of lower tuition rates.

Biblical Studies by Distance Learning

(Undergraduate Studies Only)

Dr. James Dixon, Jr founder of Antioch Experience Institute, has developed an extensive overview study of the Bible for undergraduate students who have little or no formal Bible College or seminary training. The Biblical Studies series contains 20 survey courses covering a chapter-by-chapter study of all 66 Old and New Testament books.

Each course is worth 6 undergraduate credit hours if you read the book, take the exam, and write the preaching-teaching outlines. Courses are only worth 3 undergraduate credit hours if you read the book and take the exam.

The text books for the Biblical Studies tracks include:

The Holy Bible (The student may choose which version to use; Dr. James Dixon, Jr notes follow the New King James Version.)

Personal & Practical by Dr. James Dixon, Jr.

Volume 1: Old Testament Law

Volume 2: Old Testament History

Volume 5: New Testament

The student is required to read the assigned Bible book(s) and the matching section of the appropriate textbook. The student then takes final examination on the material covered. This final examination grade is 50% of the student's grade for the course.

If the student chooses to write the 9 preaching-teaching outlines per course, the outlines should focus on a few chosen verses and use the suggested simple outline following the format in the textbook:

- 1. Concentration**
- 2. Meditation**
- 3. Revelation**
- 4. Application**

Each of these 9 outlines is 10% of the course grade.

Biblical Studies by Private Tutoring

(Graduate Studies Only)

Rev. Dr. James Dixon, Jr. founder of Antioch Experience Institute, is available to mentor a limited number of mid-career Christian ministers on a one-on-one basis. He will personally mentor graduate-level students one day per month . . . any day of the week except Sunday.

Here's how this Biblical Studies program works:

- 1. A minister enrolls in the Biblical Studies track, agreeing to spend a minimum of 10 hours a week in disciplined private devotions under the guidance of Rev. Dr. James Dixon, Jr.**
- 2. The student completes the COME-REAP Methodology course (2 cr.hrs.)**
- 3. The goal is to develop personal and practical notes on selected portions of Scripture within one year (on all 260 chapters in the New Testament, for example). The mentoring partner will write on at least five chapters each week, focusing on a few chosen verses in each chapter and using the COME-REAP Methodology:**
 - (1) Concentration**
 - (2) Meditation**
 - (3) Revelation**
 - (4) Application**
- 4. Every four to six weeks, the mentoring partner will meet with Rev. Dr. James Dixon, Jr personally (or by telephone or on-line) to review the work, to compare spiritual insights, to discuss revealed truths, and to sharpen each other's ministry skills. (See Romans 1:11-12) At each monthly meeting, the previous month's work will be reviewed and discussed, new assignments will be made, and the next appointment will be scheduled.**
- 5. At the end of one year, the mentoring partner in this example would have produced a 260-page personal and practical devotional commentary on the entire New Testament . . . to use in his preaching and teaching, to publish as a book, to preserve and pass along to his family, and to serve as a resource for mentoring others.**

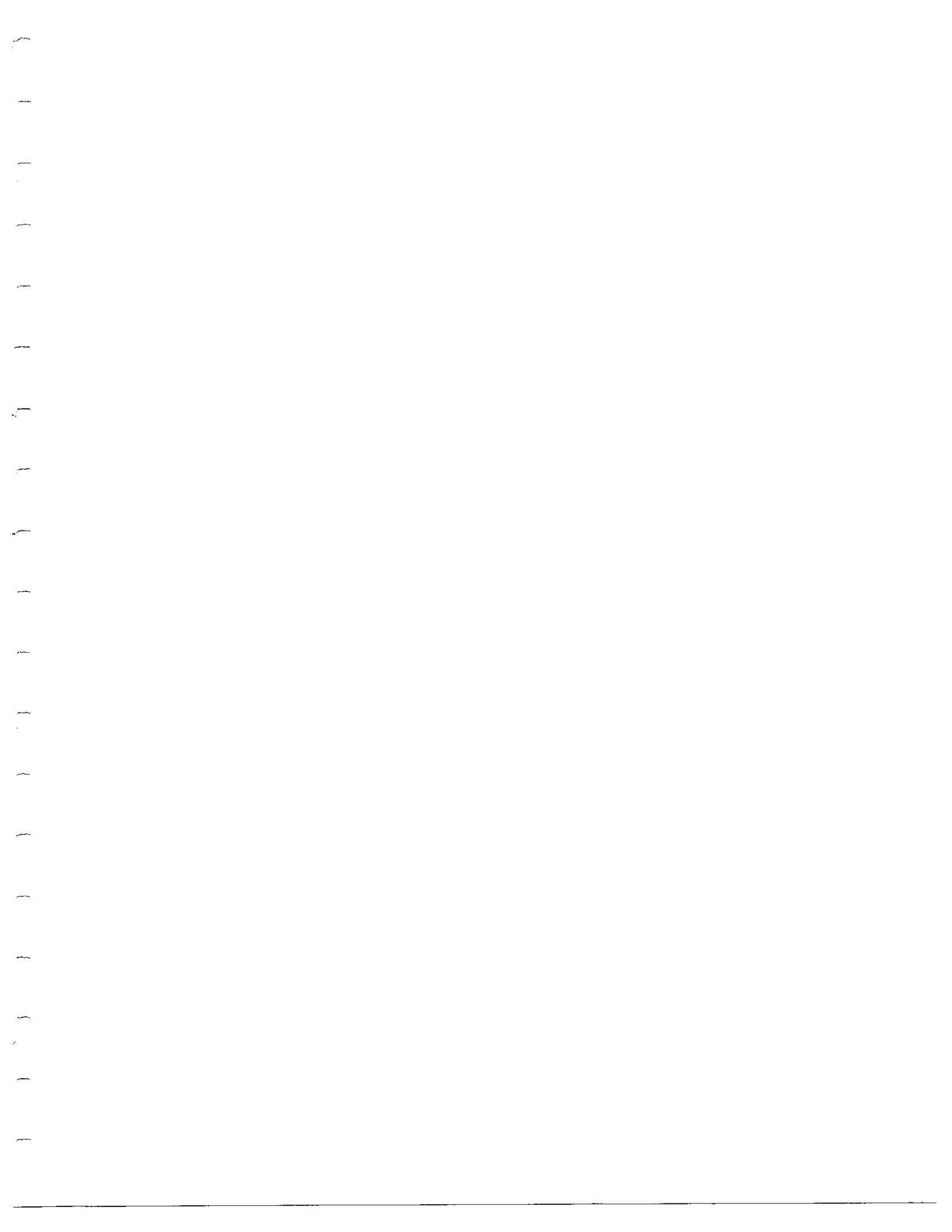

Policies and Procedures

1. The \$50 student registration fee remains valid for only three months, during which time the applicant must make the required initial payment for his/her degree program and apply for the student loan, agreeing to make the monthly payments.
2. The \$50 registration fee is non-refundable, unless the applicant is not accepted as a student by the school. In this case the \$50 fee will be refunded in full.
3. The refund policy for the new student's initial payment (or the new student's tuition payment in full) is as follows:
 - Withdrawal within one week – 100%
 - Withdrawal within two weeks – 75%
 - Withdrawal within three weeks – 50%
 - Withdrawal within four weeks – 25%
 - Withdrawal after 30 days – 0
4. A student may discontinue making the contracted monthly payments on his/her student loan at any time, but no refunds will be made.
5. If a student defaults on making his/her student loan payments as contracted, the following penalties will apply:
 - Monthly payment up to 30 days late – no penalty (grace period)
 - Monthly payment 30-90 days late - \$25 per month late fee
 - Monthly payment more than 90 days late – student is placed on “*inactive status*,” and the late fee charges continue to accumulate at the rate of \$25 per month.
 - Monthly payment more than 180 days (six months) late – the entire student loan becomes due and payable.
6. A student should complete at least one course per month in order to finish the degree program as scheduled. After 1 year of inactivity, a student will be placed on “*inactive status*”
7. A student may request, in writing, to be placed temporarily on “*inactive status*.”
8. A \$50 fee & any increase in tuition will apply to reactivate a student who has been placed on “*inactive status*.”
9. Appeals to these policies and procedures must be made in writing to the Academic Dean, and the student will be notified of the school's ruling within 30 days.
